

Dr. Shuhan Wang will be visiting Seattle on January 30, 2006 to speak at the International Education Leadership Summit.



Dr. Shuhan C. Wang is Supervisor for World Languages and International Education for the Department of Education in the State of Delaware, USA. Her research interests include intergenerational transmission of heritage language and culture; heritage and foreign language education; teacher education and professional development; language policies, planning, and practices; and international education.

Under her leadership, the State of Delaware was honored as a co-recipient (along with Kentucky) of the Goldman Sachs Award for Excellence in International Education in December, 2005. She is President-Elect of the National Council of State Supervisors For Languages (NCSSFL) and serves on the Boards of Foreign Language Annals (ACTFL), Chinese Language Teacher Association (CLTA), and the Longview Foundation for International Understanding. Since 1998, she has been directing the Chinese Teachers Summer Institute at the University of Pennsylvania, dedicating to the training and preparation of Chinese language teachers in the US. She frequently speaks at conferences, conducts workshops, and evaluates or participates in national or international projects. Examples of her publications include the recently released report of the Asia Society, [*Expanding Chinese Language Capacity in the United States*](#) (2005), *Chinese for Youth*, Vol. 1 (Far East Book, 1997), and chapters in *Mapping the Course of the Chinese Language Field* (CLTA, 1999), *Heritage Languages in America, Preserving a National Resource* (Delta Systems, 2001), and *Heritage Language Acquisition: A New Field Emerging* (Lawrence Erlbaum, in press, co-authored with Dr. Nancy Hornberger).
